## Two New Public Directors to Join ABET Board

*Baltimore, MD* — ABET is welcoming two new Public Directors to its Board of Directors:

- **C. William Bevins, FAIA, NCARB**, has been a Principal in the architecture firm FreemanWhite, Inc., in Charlotte, NC, since 2002. He served as the president of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in 2002 and as president of the National Architectural Accrediting Board in 2006.
- **Noelle L. Kehrberg, Ph.D.**, is a Professor in the Department of Health Sciences at Western Carolina University.

Public Directors are not affiliated with applied science, computing, engineering, or technology through either training or practice. They are voting members of the Board and may serve up to two consecutive three-year terms. Both Bevins and Kehrberg will begin the first year of their terms at the fall Board meeting, to be held in San Antonio, Texas, on October 31.

In addition to Bevins and Kehrberg, the following individuals will serve as Public Directors for the 2009-2010 term:

- **Sylvia L. Alexander** will begin the second year of her second three-year term as a Public Director. Alexander is the Michigan Department of Transportation's Administrative Manager and Personnel Liaison in the agency's Bureau of Finance and Administration and Executive Offices.
- **Peter Haas, Ph.D.**, will begin the third year of his second three-year term as a Public Director. Haas is a Professor of Political Science and Transportation Management for the Department of Political Science/Mineta Transportation Institute at San Jose State University.
- **Margaret I. Keller** will begin the second year of her first three-year term as a Public Director. She is the owner of Organizational Success, a facilitation and consulting firm for not-for-profits. In addition, she is the Co-Qualifying Broker for K.L. Werner & Associates, LLC, and a technical trainer for the Greater Albuquerque Association of Realtors.
